- 1. We demand increased representation of the Union's voice in the university administration.
- 2. We demand that the Board and administration see the complexity and diversity of our departments and respect their own decisions in orchestrating the move to Vienna.
- 3. The RSC declares its solidarity with the organizations tied to CEU, like the OLIve Program, the Open Society Archive, and CEU Press.
- 4. We demand the administration agree on a robust and effective sexual harassment policy in dialogue with students, faculty, and staff.
- 5. The RSC demands better recruitment of students in the region, particularly Hungary; increased connections between CEU and other universities in the region; and free Hungarian classes for students, faculty, and staff to forge a closer relationship between us and Hungarians beyond the CEU "bubble."

Who Can Speak In The Open Society: A response to the provost's email from Nov 5

The provost sent an email to wider CEU community about what happened during the U.S. ambassador's lecture on October 10. He admitted some "lapse of judgment" in handling dissent, but that "a thorough internal investigation concluded that no legal regulations or internal CEU policies have been broken."

On October 10, CEU called itself lucky for having a "personal friend of president Trump" to give us a talk on the "American dream", with the hope that this alliance could benefit CEU's position in Hungary. It did not. While the boot-licking exercise turned out to be a failure (although we would be happy to be proved wrong), the meeting with the ambassador unravelled the more sinister meaning of the slogan rethinking open society.

It is inevitable that a freshly appointed representative of Trump's government would receive some criticism in an U.S. American university that prides itself to be the beating heart of Open Society. Instead:

- Some students were singled out because of they had expressed on Facebook their intention to protest; those students were summoned to a private consultation with the dean of the students. That is highly unusual and threatening.
 - Pictures of at least one of those students were seen on the security desk during the day of the talk; which suggests that there were high orders to keep those people
- The security initially expelled that student from the auditorium, forcibly took him out of the Nador 15 building, and eventually let him back in only after the atten of a CELI staff member.

In 2016 CEU paid Ignatieff:

- a salary of \$219,202
- a housing stipend of \$26,731
- health and dental coverage of \$51,631
- a relocation reimbursement of \$44,727
- a phone stipend of \$4,090
- a fund for "furthering his professional and research development" of \$20,000
- and a non-taxable bonus of \$127,179

That's a total of \$493,560, but we're told there isn't enough money for stuc



In 2016 CEU paid <u>Liviu Matei</u>:

\$352,384



The median salary of University vice presidents in the US is \$187,039/year.*


According to CEU's website the cost of living in Vienna is €950/month.

Dear Members of the CEU Community,

Over the past few weeks posters have appeared across the university, signed by an anonymous group calling itself the Radical Student Collective. Against the spirit of CEU, the authors have made unsubstantiated claims—particularly around the transition to Vienna, quoting incorrect levels of student stipend, reports of staff costs not being remunerated etc.—and violated the privacy rights of individuals who belong to the CEU community and are working for its welfare.

At a time when we face a difficult transition, these posters are not a positive contribution. They spread a message of division and set members of this community against each other at a time when we need to display unity in the face of substantial pressures from outside.

Any group, faculty student or staff, who wishes to present demands or make representations to CEU's leadership can always do so, at short notice. Our doors are always open. Those who choose instead to practice a politics of anonymous denunciation and misinformation are betraying the spirit of the university.

A personal note, as the messages have now escalated to become personal:

We are an international university: CEU salaries and student stipends are checked against international benchmarks. In deciding the remuneration of the University's most senior staff, including the Provost and myself, the Compensation Committee of CEU (led by the Chair of Board, Leon Botstein) sets the salary, in accordance with US university practices.
